Real Lives Law- 2014

Promotes self-directed support options for individuals receiving DDS services and assures that Self-Direction information, outreach, training and safeguards are provided.

Over 1585 people enrolled in Self-Directed supports.

Gives people the opportunity to use their DDS budget to purchase supports and services that address their needs and goals.



Why do people choose to Self-Direct?

- Already know what they want to do.
- Have already been self-directing through a DESE program.
- Participants gain confidence by feeling empowered and in charge of their lives.
- Haven't felt that traditional day programs or services were a good fit.
- Want to focus on individualized, community based services.
- People like flexibility and having more creativity.
- Want to explore various activities and interest to develop a vision.
- Are concerned about public health issues.
- Have a provider in mind that they want to hire to provide the supports.
- Don't want to be associated with DDS- type services, but still need support.

Principles of Self-Determination


Freedom to plan your own life and to pursue the things that are important to you.

Authority over an individual support budget.

Support to organize resources in ways that are life enhancing and meaningful.

Responsibility for the wise use of public dollars and recognition of the contribution that people with disabilities can make in their communities.

Confirmation of the important roles that self advocates can have in a newly designed system. Honoring this leadership.

Self-Directed options provide an opportunity for people to have more control in organizing and arranging their supports.


Some individuals receive services from MassHealth

Day Habilitation
Personal Care Assistance
Adult Day Health Program
Adult Foster Care

All of these services offer a plan based on measurable goals and objectives and prescribe an integrated program to address those goals.

Therapies like OT, PT, Speech, or nursing are available.

Your Service Coordinator will help in the referral process for these services when appropriate.





Self-Direction can be a good fit for ASD

Individuals with Autism without an intellectual disability (ASD)

- Some individuals need very little support in directing their services.
- Technology can be a resource in setting up schedules and systems.
- Support Brokers- DDS staff assist participants throughout the process.

Individuals with ASD might need assistance with communication, daily activities and navigating their community.

- ■In attending college
- ☐ Learning to drive
- □Creating a community garden
- □Robotics training program
- ■Karate or fitness classes

Self-Directed Services are Flexible and Individualized

Vision: Can relate to work, health, friendships, home and social life.

- Consider all of the options.....Who do you know, what is your network, might they be a good provider?
- Work, Community activities, Health and well-being, Art, Music....
- What are the building blocks to move in this direction?
- Community first.....Use regular places.
- Take a class, volunteer at the hospital, practice community skills, join a local club, learn how to use a computer at a workshop at the library.

Vision- let's focus on the future

What is the meaning of my life?

What is my journey?

How can I discover who I am?

What makes my life a good life for me?

What motivates me?

What supports or activities will help me move forward?





Person Centered Planning

Traditional Service Model

New normal?

- Traditional Services involve a DDS Contract with a licensed agency that provides particular services.
- The agency takes sole responsibility for hiring, training, directing and scheduling the employees. The program's structure is established by the agency
- Examples: Group homes, work programs, day programs



Agency with Choice (AwC)

Offers an opportunity for people to have more involvement and <u>share</u> the responsibilities with a qualified Agency.

The individual/family is responsible for selecting their employees and day to day scheduling and supervising.

Agency employs and pays the worker, assumes payroll withholdings and tax and Workers Compensation responsibilities. Agency monitors budget and supports individual with questions.

AWC can support individuals to find particular activities that fit their lifestyle and schedule. A chance for new opportunities.

Offers connections and social options



- Help people design individualized services.
- supports personal choice and control.
- you decide who provides services and how they are delivered.
- Is based on the belief that individuals and families are in the best position to know about their support needs.



Participant Directed Program (PDP)

A plan and budget are developed by identifying the participant's vision and support needs.

Individual makes decisions on how to use their DDS funded allocation within guidelines.

Individual/ family hire and oversee the support workers.

Individual works with the **Support Broker** on an ongoing basis to customize their services through a Person Centered Planning ... It's a partnership.

Public Partnerships, LLC (PPL) provides Financial Management Services.

PDP offers the most flexibility, control and independence.



The role of a Support Broker is to <u>assist</u> the participant

- Develop the vision with the person and identify the needs
- Consider all resources and natural supports
- Help build a varied life
- Develop a budget based on needs
- Select service codes
- Identify providers
- Select employer of record
- Writing job descriptions
- Determine pay

Financial Management Service- DDS has a contract

Perform CORI and National Background check

Process the provider applications


Issue paychecks to providers every two weeks

Withhold appropriate taxes at the state and federal level

Issue W-2 and 1099 statements in January


Provide payroll status reports throughout year



Considerations

- O How much responsibility is the individual/family able to assume?
- Are you willing to learn to direct his/her own services. You will have help.
- Laying the groundwork may take more time in getting started.
- Some people don't want to do a lot of work related to their services, they may prefer AWC or Traditional Services
- Combinations of services might be a good starting point
